# British Association for Nurses in Cardiovascular Care (BANCC) 5 Year Strategic Plan 2022 – 2027

#### 1. Our Five-Year Vision statement

To promote excellence in cardiovascular nursing.

#### 2. Our Mission

BANCC is the national voice for all nurses involved in the care of people with cardiovascular health, science and disease. Our aim is to promote and support nurses who work with cardiovascular patients. We aim to achieve this through national representation and collaboration, sharing evidence-based practice, and supporting professional development.

#### 3. About BANCC

BANCC is a membership organisation that represents all nurses involved in cardiovascular care. We are an affiliate group of the British Cardiac Society (BCS) and are the only nursing organisation affiliated to this society covering all aspects of cardiovascular nursing. BANCC was first established as an organisation over 20 years ago and has a range of activities that support and strengthen the national voice of cardiovascular nursing. We send a newsletter to members quarterly to update members on BANCC activities and opportunities advertise upcoming events that will help to promote evidence-based practice and support professional development.
